- 1** Title of the lesson plan.
- 2** Part of the lesson plan ‘Description.’
- 3** The main subject of the lesson plan.
- 4** Related subjects connected to the lesson plan.
- 5** Main grade/learning level as well as related learning levels.
  - In this example, the main grade for which this lesson plan was created is Grade 4. The lesson plan is also appropriate for learners in Grades 5 and 6.
- 6** Estimated time for the lesson plan.
  - This is an estimate. Please feel free to adjust the length of the lesson to suit your class.
- 7** To start a new search, click the ‘Clear Search’ button (see Tip Sheet #2: “Three Ways to Search for Lesson Plans”)
