



# Complete Lesson Plans that have *Been Shared* with NCCIE

**In this Tip Sheet:** You will learn about the display of lesson plan documents and how to access them when complete lesson plans have been shared with NCCIE.

- Some contributors decided to share whole lesson plans that they had created independently of NCCIE templates. In these instances, they shared complete documents with NCCIE, which were uploaded to their own pages. These documents contain everything you need to deliver the lesson.
- Educators can download the lesson plan document(s) to their computers, read them, print them (if desired), and teach the lessons.
- The illustration on the right shows three types of displays you may encounter when a complete lesson plan has been shared with NCCIE. These are described below.

- 1 This lesson plan document is one lesson. Click on the 'File' to open and read it.
- 2 This document is an entire unit plan with several lessons. Click on the 'File' to open and read it.
- 3 All the instructions for the discussions and activities in this lesson are described in detail in the third document. The other documents are important to read for: a) "How to Use this Lesson Plan;" b) "Background Reading Material;" and c) a handout for the students, *List of Archaeological Terms*.
- 4 To download the lesson plan document(s) so you can save them to your desktop and/or print them, click one of these buttons in the upper right-hand corner of the webpage.
- 5 Find the downloaded document(s) in your Downloads folder on your computer.
